Superintendent's Message

The Demands of Change



One of the realities of the current era is that change will not only occur but it will occur at a rapid rate. Peter Block, author of *Managing Transitions*, has stated that it is not change that bothers people but the transition. From time to time our alumni ask, "What's new at Lutheran High?" The reality of change and the nature of the question prompt an article on things that are changing at our Lutheran High Schools.

We have witnessed a lot of change in the past decades. Teachers come and go and some retire. While our focus on mission remains the same, we have acquired new assets and opportunities for mission. Some are physical changes on campus and others relate to how we do business. We are carefully managing the transitions.

For example, in the past decade we built a new field house at Milwaukee Lutheran, improved tracks and athletic facilities, and installed new bleachers on athletic fields at Milwaukee Lutheran and Martin Luther. Almost simultaneously the Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association dissolved and private and parochial schools were absorbed into the WIAA. When we added lights on both campuses we changed to night games for football and soccer. Of course, we will eventually have such great facilities at Lake Country Lutheran as well.

These improvements have also brought opportunities. We now have visitors on campus who are not familiar with a Christian community. The night games have also appealed to people who just want to enjoy interscholastic competition. Our choirs and bands have traveled nationally and, in some cases, internationally with a corresponding increase in the quality of their performances based on these unique experiences.

With all the changes in campus climate, however, we are examining changes in our approaches to hospitality and security. In the next several months we will pay a lot of attention to upgrading our strategies to make people feel welcome and to understand the meaning of our Christian community. On the security side, we will be working with professional planners to make sure that people will be safe at public events regardless of the time of day or location of the event on our campus.

These are proactive measures designed to anticipate opportunities and needs, to welcome our guests, and to make sure high standards of security are in place. It may be true that Mickey Mouse and Goofy are actual security agents at Disneyland, but they also deploy visible security agents to care for visiting families. We intend to do things that create our own hospitable and secure environment as we care for visiting students, families, and friends.

David Bahr Honored District Secondary Lutheran Educator of the Year

David Bahr, math teacher at Lake Country Lutheran High School (LCL) was named Secondary Lutheran Educator of the Year by the South Wisconsin District. He was honored along with other recipients at a special dinner at the Silver Spring Country Club in Menomonee Falls on March 5.

David has served Lutheran education for 19 years as a math teacher, and 3 of those years have been at Lake Country Lutheran. He graduated from Concordia University-River Forest in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in education, with a mathematics major and computer science minor. He received his master of education degree with a specialization in mathematics from Indiana Wesleyan University in 1997.

David has a team-based approach to learning and he readily assumes additional responsibilities beyond teaching in order to improve the

academic and spiritual growth of his students. David also takes the lead in promoting service opportunities for students that extend around the world. His passion for sharing Christ with those less fortunate is a great example for the students. Colleague, **Nancy Koopman** describes David's teaching experience as "An invaluable addition to our faculty. David's ability to recognize and pursue excellence in all areas of our students' lives, in addition to mathematics, is vital to the goals of our faculty." Other awards David has received include Presidential Excellence in Teaching Mathematics and Science and Lutheran School Teacher of the Year (Indiana).

Eric Pankow Receives Inaugural James J. Juergensen Master Educator Award

Eric Pankow, physics instructor at Milwaukee Lutheran High School (MLHS) was named James J. Juergensen Master Educator by Concordia University-Wisconsin (CUW). He was recognized at CUW's graduation.

Eric earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education, with a major in physical science and a minor in mathematics from Concordia University-River Forest in 1983. He received his master's degree in professional development from Cardinal Stritch in 1998. Eric joined the MLHS faculty in 1984. He is recognized for his ability to inspire his students with creative teaching methods. Senior Kate Du Mez said, "Mr. Pankow's enthusiasm for physics and his knowledge of the subject makes it easy and enjoyable to learn in class." "Mr. Pankow has taught

me for two years now and I have been thoroughly blessed by having him as a teacher. Not only does he have extensive knowledge as a physics teacher but he is a strong Christian and makes it evident in his teaching," said senior Will Van Weelden.

Other awards Eric has received includes Heartland Teacher of Merit (twice), Milwaukee School of Engineering Excellence in High School Teaching, Kohl Foundation Fellowship, and Tandy Technology Scholars Outstanding Teacher.

This award recognizes outstanding educators for their skills, dedication, and expertise in Lutheran secondary education. It will be made annually based on nominations by members of the Concordia University-Wisconsin community.

MLHS Band Tour 2006

The 160 member MLHS band safely returned from Florida on April 1 after an 11-day tour. The highlight of the tour was a performance on March 25 by the Marching Band at the Pre-electric Light Parade in Disney's Magic Kingdom before an estimated crowd of 20,000 people. The Marching Band also performed at Universal Studio's Islands of Adventure. The Symphonic Band performed in a chapel service at Orlando Lutheran Academy where **Wayne Jensen** (MLHS 1986), former teacher at MLHS from 1991-2005, is the administrator. The Flute Choir and Brass Ensemble also participated in the morning service at St. Luke's Lutheran Church. The Pom Pon/Dance Squad participated in a special 2½ hour dance clinic where they learned an actual routine used in a Disney show. The band also had the opportunity to go to Cocoa Beach, attend a number of devotions led by Pastor Bruce Harmann, and spent several days at the theme parks.

MLHS Engineering Club Competes in the 2006 Wisconsin State Rube Goldberg Competition

The Milwaukee Lutheran Engineering Club competed in the State Rube Goldberg competition for the 7th consecutive year. The club is open to all students and develops the God-given gifts of the members in creative thinking, planning, teamwork, problem solving, and construction. The club advisor is **Mr. Eric Pankow** (Physics Instructor) who is assisted by **Mr. Dave Irish** (Tech Ed Instructor) and **Mr. John Kovacich** (parent). This year's national project for the contest was: Shred 5 sheets of paper individually into strips in 20 or more steps.

The team's machine had a theme of Super-Shredders and highlighted the use of comic book characters to shred the paper. The machine shredded the 5 sheets in 5 different places, including a set of rolling can lids, a car with blades under it, a guillotine, a set of spring-pulled razor blades, and a falling blade.

Martin Luther Choral Groups Hit The "Road To Freedom"

Under the direction of **Timothy Franz** (ML 1976), the Concert Choir and Troubadours performed four full concerts and sang at three church services during the nine-day tour which ended April 1. The choirs were accompanied by chaperones **Kathye Franz** (wife of the director), **Erin Walter** (ML 1998), **Nicole Leeland** (ML 1992), and **Paul Kindschi** (ML science teacher).

Tour concerts were performed at Christ the Shepherd Lutheran Church (Alpharetta, GA), Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church (Warner Robins, GA), Hope Lutheran Church (Wake Forest, NC), and St. Peter Lutheran Church (Conover, NC). The students sang for all three Sunday morning services at Christ the Shepherd. Students were greeted by warm, receptive audiences who sat enthralled with the beautiful music being performed. The choirs were blessed to receive standing ovations at the end of each concert they performed.

As on all tours, some down time was provided for the students to do sightseeing at the Sand Dunes Resort at Myrtle Beach. Choir Tours give students the opportunity to use their abilities to be witnesses of their faith. In post-tour reflections, it was clear that students had their faith affected by tour events. Senior Stephanie Peterson stated, "I felt at each concert as if God was truly blessing the songs we were singing and that His Holy Spirit was entering people's hearts." Senior Robert Moore wrote, "I enjoy spreading the Word of God through my singing, experiencing different congregations, and talking with other people about my faith."

Cheerleading Places 3rd at State for 2nd Consecutive Year!

The Red Knight cheerleaders brought home the 3rd Place trophy in Division 2 Small Cheer at the state competition in February. Dealing with an injury to one of the members of the team in the week leading up to state, the team regrouped and performed exceptionally well to win the 3rd Place trophy. The team is coached by **Gail Wanta** and **Chris Eurich**.

Kate DuMez Finishes Girls Basketball Career as 2nd Leading Scorer in MLHS History!

Senior point guard **Kate DuMez**, a 4-year varsity starter, finished her career at MLHS with 931 total points, the second highest career point total in MLHS girls' basketball history. **Tami Tills** scored 1011 points for the Red Knights in 1974-1978. During her 4-year career at MLHS, Kate led the team to 2 Regional Championships, and North Shore Conference finishes in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 5th place.

Derrick Hankins Scores 1000 Points!

Senior point guard **Derrick Hankins** became the fourth Red Knight boys basketball team member to score 1000 points in his career on January 3 in a home game against Whitefish Bay. Derrick's 1000th point came on a 3-point "bomb" from about 26 feet late in the fourth quarter of the game. Derrick joins **Pat McCabe, Randy Shields, and Pete Feierhabend** in the exclusive 1000 point club at MLHS.

A 4-year varsity starter, Derrick finished his career with 1256 total points, second only to Pete Feierhabend, who scored 1306 points back in 1957-1960. Derrick was named Co-Player of the Year in the North Shore Conference this year, along with Sherrod Smith of Whitefish Bay.

Boys Basketball Team Wins 4th Consecutive Regional Championship!

The Red Knight boys basketball team captured their 4th consecutive Regional Championship by defeating Whitefish Bay 76-71 in the Regional final game at Germantown on March 4. **Derrick Hankins** scored 27 of his 33 points in the second half of the game, and some great free-throw shooting down the stretch secured the win for the Red Knights.

The Red Knight's season ended the following week in a 66-64 loss to St. John's Northwestern Military Academy, led by UW-Madison recruit Trevon Hughes, in the Sectional Semifinal game at Homestead. The team finished their season with an overall record of 18-5, and a record of 12-2 in the North Shore Conference, enough for 2nd place behind Whitefish Bay. The team is coached by **Jason Moesch**.

Martin Luther Swim Competes at State

The ML boys swimming program continues to make waves in the pool as progress over the last 3 years has steadily moved them into the top 20 teams in the state meet. Despite not having a pool at Martin Luther and having to constantly compete on the road, the boys swim team has made some great progress according to **Coach Schultz**.

The swim team finished 18th out of 43 Division 2 teams in the State Swim meet held in Madison. The State qualifiers included **Michael Schultz, Brian Bernier, Adam Baird, and Chris Beal**. Junior **Michael Schultz** had an outstanding meet as he finished 2nd in State in the 500 freestyle and set a school record of 4:46:48. Schultz also had an outstanding 4th place finish in the 200 freestyle with another school record time of 1:46:48. In addition, the 200 medley team of Schultz, Baird, Bernier, and Beal finished 11th in a school record time of 1:46:48.

Michael Schultz was also honored recently by the USA Swimmers Association as an All-American-Scholar athlete in swimming and was also named by the Wisconsin Swimming Coaches Association as an Honorable Mention All State Swimming Team member in the 500 Freestyle event.
